Dear Parents,

We are excited to welcome your teen to our French program! This semester, students will embark on a language-learning journey through engaging, project-based units that encourage creativity, collaboration and meaningful communication.

Below is an overview of the key learning objectives for this first semester

Communication Skills:

- Greet and introduce themselves and others
- Talk about countries, languages and cultures
- Describe people, family members and their personality traits
- Share preferences, opinions and tastes
- Ask and answer questions in everyday contexts
- Talk about school subjects, schedules and daily routines
- Describe clothing and express possession
- Talk about hobbies, weekend activities and personal experiences
- Participate in class presentations, interviews and role-plays

Grammar and Sentence Structures:

- Use the verbs *être* and *avoir* to present and describe
- Ask and answer questions using interrogatives (Comment, Quel, Où, Est-ce que...)
- Use definite and indefinite articles, and apply correct gender and number agreement
- Conjugate common verbs (aimer, habiter, faire, porter, sortir, prendre, etc.) in the present tense
- Use possessive adjectives (mon, ton, notre, etc.) and subject pronouns
- Apply adjectives to describe physical appearance, clothing, and personality

Vocabulary Development:

- Numbers, dates, age and time
- Nationalities, countries and languages
- Family, professions and physical/personal descriptions
- School and classroom vocabulary
- Clothing and fashion
- Daily routines and typical schedules
- Hobbies, sports and weekend activities
- Food, meals and animals
- Emotions, tastes and opinions
